I thought that Professor Soroko taught the course very effectively. His use of a lecture alongside examples made doing the homework and studying for the tests much easier. I think that practice quizzes would have made the class even more clear. We are given a practice test before every midterm, but I believe a practice quiz would make the class even better! Attending the lectures, completing the homework, understanding the practice tests all were important for my understanding of the course material. In Calculus II, I was forced to think critically about how each problem is solved, and to have a firm understanding of the methods/proofs used.

My absolute favorite part of the class is how Dr. Soroko would work out key problems and thoroughly explain important concepts regarding each problem. His teaching style allows him to be extremely efficient in getting the whole concept across in a timely manner and to the degree that the majority of the class understands it well (and if you didn't understand it at first, he will gladly answer your questions after class). His teaching style is what mainly contributed to my overall learning efficiency. Despite how fast we have to learn the material in order to get through everything before the final, I never felt rushed, flustered, unprepared, or completely lost/clueless in the class. The WebAssign homework assignments helped me learn how to think critically because I got the chance to work out entire problems, see where I was lacking, and fix the issue on my own. The practice exams were also a huge help because I was able to practice timing myself and become comfortable with the pace I would have to go due to the time constraint. Due to the fact that he is a research professor and only teaches a quarter of the time, I honestly feel sorry for the kids who will have to take calculus II with an okay/average/borderline professor instead of having the opportunity and chance to have Dr. Soroko because I wish more professors had the same standard of patience (in answering everyone's questions and staying after class to help students), standard of care/concern for their students success (concern about the student's grades and what he, as the professor, can do to help teach a certain concept better) and teaching efficiency.

Prof Soroko was very clearly knowledgable in Calc 2. His lessons weren't always the most clear, but that could be more because of my personal disdain for calculus. I didn't always feel comfortable to ask a question in class, but I could tell that he was doing his best to help everyone pass. I really enjoyed all the practice that was offered, but since there are 40 homeworks, I think a couple could be dropped. I think all the tests and quizzes are fair. I really appreciated the practice versions of the tests. Compared to other calc 2 profs' approaches, I think students could benefit from being able to use a notecard on the test for sections that require lots of formulas.



This class was listed as web based and I wasn't able to properly take the course. This should be changed in the course listing.




(CS-04)What is your current LSU GPA?




(CS-05)How many hours per week did you spend preparing for class?




(CS-06)What is your expected grade in this course?




(CS-07)What is your reason for taking this course?



(CS-08)Were you employed full-time or part-time while taking this course?




